Management MATTERS

One of the best sources of input and information required to effectively manage the community of Talega comes directly from the membership. This information is so important that management and staff need to hear it directly from you.

I occasionally hear from members who tell me that they informed the landscapers of an issue, yet the issue, still persists. I always respond with the following: Did you report this issue to Talega management and/or staff? This is because the landscape maintenance is divided into several teams with specific skillsets to deal with the following landscape elements: minor tree pruning, major tree trimming, irrigation, trimming, weeding, and planting projects. They are hardworking individuals that do only what they are trained to do. They do not carry pens and note pads to take member input and only report major issues to their supervisors, who in turn report the issues to the Landscape Management Team.

The most effective method to have an issue resolved is to report it directly to management and staff at the Talega Swim & Athletic Club. We use a detailed work order database that enables the Talega team to provide the proper direction to the proper maintenance personnel, and then track the issue to solution while providing feedback to the interested members.

The Talega team needs to hear directly from the members because we do not want to lose any important information in the communication chain (eliminate the middle man). Additionally, our team members are likely to have a few questions for the member reporting the issue that will better enable the maintenance crew to quickly and effectively resolve the issue.

Please remember when contacting the Talega team to give us the following pertinent information:

Your name, address, telephone number, email address (optional), issue (be as specific as possible), location of the issue, and anything else you feel is important and germane to the issue.

When in doubt, call the Talega Swim & Athletic Club at (949) 361-8466 or email maintenance@talegatoday.com. If you feel the matter is a property- threatening emergency, call (800) 428-5588 and follow the instructions.

Election

Talega Maintenance Corporation Director Election - November 14, 2023

The Talega Maintenance Corporation (TMC) Election will be held on Tuesday, November 14, 2023, to elect two (2) members to the TMC Board of Directors for a three- (3) year term. The Board of Directors is comprised of representatives elected by the membership (homeowners). The Board of Director's role is to supervise the properties of the corporation, approve and oversee budgets, and make decisions which strive for the betterment of the corporation in accordance with the legal documents.

How Does the TMC Election Process Work?

A neighborhood delegate system was set in place to assist in achieving quorum for the election. The requirement for quorum is 25% of the voting power of the corporation. State law requires a ballot with a two-envelope system. It is important for members to complete and mail in their ballot in the envelopes provided. There will be a Meet the Candidates Night at the Delegate Meeting on Wednesday, October 18, 2023, and the votes will be counted immediately following the Annual Meeting/Election on Tuesday, November 14, 2023. An election notice and ballot will be sent to all homeowners in advance of the Annual Meeting. We strongly encourage your active participation in this election.

Call for Inspectors of Election Volunteer Assistants

Are you interested in exploring volunteer opportunities as a means of giving back to the community? If so, we encourage you to support the election process by assisting the Inspector of Election with the important task of counting ballots. Please note that volunteers must not be members of the Board of Directors, candidates running for the Board of Directors, or related to a member of the Board of Directors. Your contribution as a volunteer will greatly support the smooth and efficient operation of the election process.

How to Apply

If you are interested in running for a position on the Board of Directors or volunteering to assist the Inspector of Election with counting ballots for the upcoming election in November, please complete the Board of Directors Candidacy Statement or the Election Volunteer Form, which can both be found at **talegatoday.com/documents** or by scanning the QR code below.

All forms must be submitted and received by **5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 5, 2023,** for your application to be considered. The Board of Directors would like to express their gratitude in advance to those members who are willing to volunteer their time to support the procedures for the upcoming election.

You may only safelist a vehicle for 14 days in a 30-day window per household.

If you live in a sub-association, please contact your subassociation's property management company for their parking rules and parking vendor. Those communities include: Carmel, Trinidad, Gallery, Verano, and Talega Village (Alassio/Santalana).


FIREWORKS

POOL REMINDERS

As you gather for a fun-filled day at the pool, remember that each residence is permitted a maximum of five (5) guests per day at the pool facilities. Homeowners must be present with guests for the entire duration of the visit. All pools are open for recreational use, although the lap pools are designed for lap swimmers. Please do not hang on the lane lines or swim across in front of lap swimmers.

Flotation devices will continue to be limited to U.S. Coast Guard-approved life preservers (PFDII). A life preserver is defined as a flotation device which is marked "Coast Guard Approved." This is normally a vest style, available in a variety of sizes from infant to adult and may be purchased at many local sporting goods stores for about \$30.

For safety reasons, only the following water toys are permitted at the pool facilities: blow-up beach balls, diving rings and similar diving pool toys, plastic masks, and goggles. Foam noodles are <u>not permitted</u> as pieces of the Styrofoam may break apart and become lodged in the circulation system. This is costly to repair and could result in pool closures while equipment is repaired and/or replaced.

Boogie boards, pool floats, or inflatables of any kind are not permitted and are a safety issue.

Red Flag: Look for the red flag outside of each facility to indicate any pool closures due to unexpected reasons. You may also call the pool closure line at (949) 361-8466, ext. 105, for detailed information about the pools.

Who Is Watching the Water?

Pool monitors are scheduled at all Talega pools this summer. The primary functions of the pool monitors are to ensure the safety and wellbeing of Talega residents and guests and to enforce the TMC policies. We maintain a **"SWIM AT YOUR OWN RISK"** policy—parents are responsible for watching their children at all times. Summer pool monitor service began in June and continues through September. Monitors are scheduled during the afternoon hours.

Successful Prevention: Safety Breaks

Pool monitors will be enforcing safety breaks. A safety break is a designated time for adults and children to use the restroom, get some drinking water, and re-apply sunscreen. Safety breaks also help keep our pools open and accident-free longer. There will be a 10-minute safety break during every hour. Only lap swimmers and swim lessons are exempt from the safety breaks. As a reminder, all children must wear rubber pants over their swim diaper. Rubber pants are provided free to residents. Stop by the TSAC office or talk to a pool monitor to get yours.

Swim Lessons

The Talega Maintenance Corporation annually approves instructors who swim services within the facilities maintained by the association. Once authorized, swim lessons may be provided to TALEGA MAINTENANCE ASSOCIATION RESIDENTS ONLY and must take place at the Talega Clubhouse pool. Swim lessons are not authorized at the Saluda or Tierra Grande Pools. Pictures of the authorized swim instructors for 2023 will be posted outside the pool gates. Please report unauthorized instructors to management at lifestyle@talegatoday.com or (949) 361-8466.

Pool Gatherings

A gathering is defined as a planned or scheduled event or party with fellow Talega residents or guests utilizing the Talega facility as an outdoor venue.

As the weather heats up, planning a poolside gathering sounds like the perfect way to have fun in the sun. Pool gatherings are permitted only at the TSAC clubhouse location and requires a completed application. Pool gatherings can be scheduled Monday through Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. There is a 24-guest maximum. What Can Be Done to Prevent a Bite?

Of course, the best snakebite advice is to actively avoid getting bitten in the first place. This means staying alert to your surroundings and keeping a safe distance from a rattlesnake, should you spot one.

It is best to wear sturdy shoes and long, loose-fitting pants when exploring trails or rural properties. Hands, feet, and ankles are the most common place for rattlesnake bites.

Following some common sense rules can prevent most snake bites.

- Never go barefoot or wear sandals when walking in areas where you cannot clearly see where you are placing your feet. Wear hiking boots.
- Always stay on paths. Avoid tall grass, weeds, and heavy underbrush where snakes may be present.
- Always look for concealed snakes before picking up rocks, sticks, or wood.
- Always check carefully around stumps or logs before sitting.
- When climbing, always look before putting your hands in a new location. Snakes can climb walls, trees, and rocks and are frequently found at high altitudes.
- Never grab what appear to be sticks or branches while swimming—rattlesnakes are excellent swimmers.
- Baby rattlesnakes are venomous! They can, and do, bite. Leave them alone.
- Never hike alone. Always have a buddy to help in case of an emergency. Learn basic lifesaving skills.
- Never handle freshly-killed snakes. You may still be bitten.
- Never tease a snake to see how far it can strike. You can be several feet from the snake and still be within striking distance.
- Many rattlesnake bites occur when people tease or play with their "pet" rattlesnake.
- Teach children to respect snakes and to leave them alone. Curious children who pick up snakes are frequently bitten.
- Always give snakes the right of way!

What should be done after a rattlesnake bite?

- Calm the victim.
- Transport the victim to the nearest emergency facility for further treatment.
- Phone ahead to notify the emergency facility that a snakebite victim is being brought in.

MOSQUITOES

Talega has always been pro-active with mosquito control, and even more so over the last few years with the migration of the West Nile virus to Orange County. Talega's management works with the Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District on a regular basis to review detention basins and other potential mosquito habitat and breeding areas.

Preventive measures that are employed by Talega are as follows: regular inspection of the storm drain retention basins which are stocked with Mosquito fish by the Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District (OCMVCD); and the landscape contractors inspect the V-ditches for debris and standing water.

What you can do:

These mosquitoes can live and complete their life cycle either indoors or outdoors. Eggs are laid along the waterline of any water-holding container such as: flower vases, plant saucers, buckets, used tires, and even plants that hold water like bamboo or bromeliads. Eggs can remain alive for years, and hatch into larvae when conditions are right.

An important part of mosquito control around your home is making sure that mosquitoes do not have a place to lay their eggs. Because mosquitoes need water for two stages of their life cycle, it is important to monitor standing water sources.



- Get rid of standing water in rain gutters, old tires, buckets, plastic covers, toys or any other container where mosquitoes can breed.
- Empty and change the water in birdbaths, fountains, wading pools, rain barrels and potted plant trays at least once a week to eliminate potential mosquito habitats.
- Drain temporary pools of water or fill with dirt.
- Keep swimming pool water treated and circulating.
- Do not keep water in buckets or root plant cuttings in water. Sharing plant cuttings can spread mosquito eggs.
